Reports are available to read on the R&amp;D website.</li> <li>Creative Learning Academy – approaches information sharing from more of creative arts viewpoint (e.g. workshop to using cartoons/animations to communicate effectively or how to use iPhones/iPads to make short films or digital storytelling)</li> <li>Releasing potential programme aims to develop research capability in the region.</li> <li>The "research portal" tab on their website which pulls together major networks and organizations which support research.
