## Jon Brassey & Trip (presentation uploaded to web site)

Trip started in 1997. Jon originally from the Wirral. The aim of the website originally was to help G.P. become more clinically effective. If we can't answer a clinical question on Trip we ask ourselves why not? The site is a connection with clinical reality. Hierarchy of evidence in Trip. Every month Jon Brassey manually inputs data into Trip, he is hands-on. Clinician's say that 70% of searches on Trip actually help. There are nearly 50,000 registered users. Questions and answers section is very popular. Now an option to use a PICO search format, a good way to promote the use, handy to use in training. Images are available via TRIP. Colour indicators – Green indicates high quality evidence. Filters – Synonyms. A useful Timeline for searching could help with re-validation. **The Future** RCT now available via Trip. Integration of Dynamed. Case Reports.
